1. CALL TO ORDER

A. Roll Call: Chairperson VanderBloomer, Commissioners Bautch, Thorson, Koch and Murphy

Chairperson Vanderbloomer called to order the Regular Planning Commission meeting on November 13, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. Commissioners Present: John Bautch, Michelle Koch, Gloria Murphy, and Ron Thorson. Also present: John Hughes, Councilmember; Bill Petracek, City Administrator; Kurt Glaser, City Attorney.

2. CITIZENS FORUM

No citizens were present to address the Planning Commission on items not on the agenda

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA WITH CHANGES AND CORRECTIONS

Murphy made a motion to approve the agenda as typewritten. Bautch seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

6. DISCUSSION ITEM:

A. Discuss Proposed Planned Unit Developments Ordinance

Attorney Glaser explained the need for having a Planned Unit Development Ordinance in the code book due to tightened rules for granting a variance at the State level. He added that this ordinance will allow you to consider a project, but say, "no" to a developer if they bring a crazy project to the City that does not meet your standards. He also explained that this ordinance allows you to recruit developers by using a PUD as an incentive. Discussion ensued.

Vanderbloomer asked if a project didn't meet the Comprehensive Plan requirements, would that disallow a proposed project. Glaser stated that if it fits the political environment to change the Comp Plan, no, it would not. Discussion ensued.

Vanderbloomer asked if there are any downsides to this ordinance. Glaser replied by saying if you have a network of people in local politics that would let their friends do whatever they want would be a potential downside. He cited an example in Centerville where the Commission and Council knew an individual and was well liked, and was granted permission to do a project in a residential zone that was questionable. Discussion ensued.

Bautch asked about Section 11.859 (2C) on what defines a minor change. Glaser stated that the Commission can define what a minor change would be in the ordinance. Discussion ensued.

Murphy asked about the cost of an application for a PUD. Petracek stated he is working on a specific fee for a PUD, but explained that in big projects such as the Ephesians and Landings of Lexington, fees for consultants to set-up a PUD and such are generally addressed in the development agreement due to the high costs to the developer during this process. Discussion ensued.

B. Discuss Lovell Building Realtor Request – John Chirhart – Gaughan Companies

John Chirhart, Gaughan Companies, discussed discrepancies that were omitted in the approved contract with Gaughan to sell the Lovell Building. He asked that due to the missing language providing for a minimum commission to Gaughan for the sale of the building, and the final price being dropped from \$975,000 to \$200,000, he is requesting that the sales commission be set at a sale price of \$650,000 or \$32,500 commission. Chirhart added that Gaughan Companies had already received payment for the contracted amount of \$10,000 at closing, so the City would pay \$22,500. Discussion ensued.

Mayor Kurth asked if the building sold for more than the list price, would Gaughan give the City a discount on the Commission. Chirhart replied, "No, that is my commission." Discussion ensued.

Petracek explained that the City is making a lot of money on the building permit fees, bond issuance fees, park dedication fees, and TIF funds that aren't a part of the sale

price. He recommended that the Council consider Mr. Chirharts request. Discussion ensued.

Councilmember Devries made a motion to approve the sales commission to Gaughan Companies of \$22,500 based on a \$650,000 sale price. Councilmember Harris seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-2
